From 2000 to 2013 the total number of native American workers holding a job *fell* by 1.3 million (even though the number of working-age Americans grew by 16.4 million). At the same time, the total number of immigrants (legal and illegal) with a job *increased* by 5.3 million.

Yet the U.S. government continues to import millions of working-age foreign immigrants, and proposes to bring in even more in the future.

Ignoring the plight of an estimated 22 million unemployed Americans and their families, Congress is working on legislation that will grant amnesty to an estimated 11 million to 12 million illegal aliens so they can work in the U.S., apply for citizenship, and sponsor admission of their relatives. The same politicians want to double the number of "temporary" foreign workers allowed to take additional U.S. jobs.

Immigration policy should be fair. And it is not fair to import millions of working-age foreign citizens to compete with unemployed Americans for jobs in the U.S.
